Shelving that wraps around the corner will be the home of our Large Print collection







A whole new space for teens, the Teen Room will not only house the Teen Collection but will also provide a variety of versatile furnishings including seating, study tables, and more








Provide a break from studying for area teens with this area equipped with consoles, multiple controllers, its own TV, and more

Family Histories, Microfilm, and more for patrons to discover their roots




The Community Room: \$25,000






Copying and Scanning Station: \$5,000

Create a bigger space for our fastest growing service: Outreach, which delivers books, materials, and programming to patrons who cannot come to the library in person





Cargo Area: \$10,000


Provide a place for the materials we receive from other libraries to be unpacked, processed, repackaged, and sent back home
