Scope and Content

The Archinal papers include church histories, family histories, pictorial material, and ephemera. The strength of the collection comes from the genealogical material found in the published family histories and the published church directories, also from the timelines relating to the history of St. John's Church.

The *Church history series* ranges from 1786-1988 with the bulk of the series ranging from 1838-1988, when the church celebrated its 150th anniversary. It contains registries, directories, anniversary publications and unpublished chronologies of St. John's and St. Paul's Churches. This series is arranged by date.

The family history series ranges from 197(?)-1998 with the bulk of the series in 1990 and 1998. It contains unpublished extensive notes and research on genealogy for the Archinal family, unpublished notes of the Olinger and Umberger families, and published family histories for the Archinal, Skarr, Thomas, and Kirschner families. This series is arranged alphabetically by name and then chronologically by date.



The pictorial material series includes 2 original photographs, two copies of photographs, and two postcards (duplicates). One photo depicts a tombstone inscribed in german, including the name "Archinad". The translation is glued to the back of the photo. The other photograph depicts Hattie and Lois Jean Archinal. The copies are labeled "William and Elizabeth Archinal" and "Phillip Archinal." The duplicate postcards depict St. John's Church in Dover, Ohio.

The ephemera series contains a 25th anniversary brochure for Reverend Reinhard Krause, 150th anniversary program for Ruslin Hills St. Paul United Church of Christ, a brochure for the St. John's United Church of Christ Educational Unit Building Fund Campaign, a leaflet (including pictures) of the ground-breaking ceremony for the educational building, a similar leaflet for the cornerstone laying ceremony, and finally the program for the dedication ceremony of the new education building, which took place March 5, 1967. The captioned pictures are of particular value in identifying congregation members.
